Reading

Your child's reading book will be changed on a different day to last half term. Please check the 'things to remember' column.

It is extremely important that your child reads on a daily basis so that they develop the fluency and comprehension skills required to access the primary curriculum. You need to log in the Reading Record every time you listen to your child read. This is monitored in school and if children are not reading at home they will receive a red slip, where they will have to read to a teacher at a playtime. Reading books must be kept in your child's book bag, which needs to be sent to school every day.

Writing and Maths

This half term children will be taught to write all the lower case letters. They will learn to verbally segment and blend to create CVC words. Please support your child with this at home.

In maths we are focusing on 2D and 3D shapes, length, size and number knowledge.
