In Year 1 children need to read at home EVERYDAY. The children are encouraged to become independent and to change their reading books on their own when they have completed reading it at home. To support your child with their reading please could you ask them questions about what they have read, get the children to stop at different times and make predictions about what might happen next. Talking about words that appear in the story will give your child a broader vocabulary and allow them to use more exciting vocabulary in their own writing.
