In History we can:

Appreciate how historical artefacts have helped us understand more about British lives.

Have a good understanding as to how crime and punishment has changed over the years.

Test out a hypothesis in order to answer a question.

In Art we can:

Identify and draw simple objects and draw marks and lines to produce texture.

Say why we have chosen specific materials to draw with.

Use sketchbooks to compare and discuss ideas with others.

Sculpt clay and make a 3D form.

As thinkers we can use:

The Question Key, The Brick Wall Key, The BAR Key and the Ridiculous Key.

In computing we can:

Design and make our own computer games using coding.
