PARENTS EVENING

SATs & Revision

It is getting much closer to SATs now. Your child will be bringing home revision homework on a regular basis. Please support your child with this at home. Please also ensure that your child brings their revision books back into school every day. They are missing key revision sessions when they do not have their book with them.

English & Maths

In English this half term we will be focusing on lots of Spelling, Punctuation and Grammar from across the primary curriculum, in order to prepare for the Key Stage 2 tests.

It is extremely important that your child continues to read at home on a daily basis. Children should log each time that they read in their Reading Record.

In Maths we will be focusing on statistics, measures, division and reasoning as well as recapping all of the arithmetic that they have learnt whilst in KS1 and KS2. You can keep practising the written methods with your child at home. Please look at the Calculations Policy on the website to ensure you are supporting them correctly.

Reading

It is extremely important that your child continues to read at home on a daily basis. Children should log each time that they read in their Reading Record and try to write responses in the comments section. It is still important for children in Year 6 to discuss their reading with an adult. Please ask your child questions about the books they are reading to ensure that they have understood the vocabulary and content of what they have read. Ensure children's responses are precise and not vague. This is a skill we are teaching them to prepare them for their SATs.
