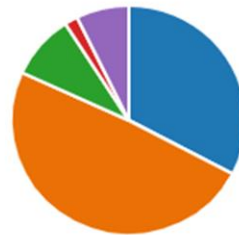
### The main findings were:

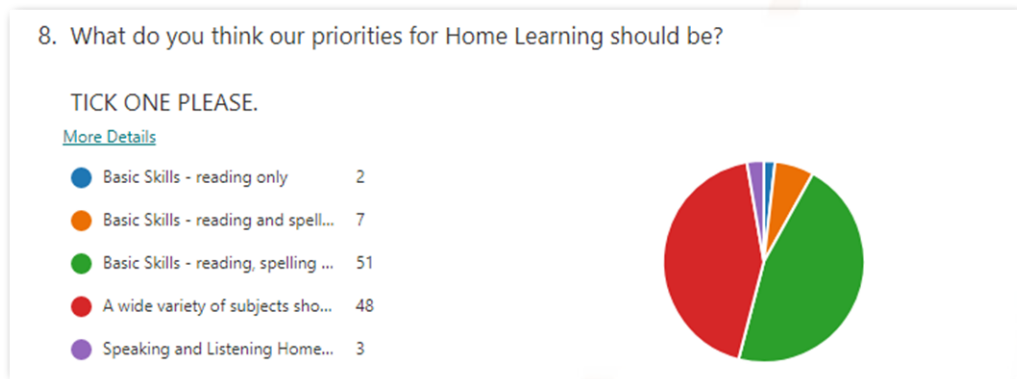




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- Parents views were split between some that would like a mix of basic skills and some that want a variety of subjects



## What does this mean for school?

- We are happy that what we are doing is meeting the needs of both school and home. We have a shared vision as to what the priorities are for home learning.
- We will continue to provide home learning grids half termly providing a balance of both basic skills, research and creative opportunities.
- The basic skills element of home learning will continue to be the priority and **if** families have the time and they wish to they can choose other areas from the Home Learning Grids
- Learning completed at home should be uploaded onto seesaw so that we can see this and acknowledge it in school.
- Please remember that you can find further creative ideas online linked to project and you can use the knowledge organiser on SeeSaw.
- We know that family time is important and that many of our parents work long hours or shift work. Home learning needs to fit round family life. It is absolutely appropriate to just support your child with the basics of reading, spelling and maths facts.
- Year 6 will continue to be set additional home learning with a specific weekly deadline to support their transition to High School.
- Education continues to be a joint partnership between home and school. Teachers will communicate with parents with specific support for their child at home as appropriate.
